[Dr. Kajsa Ahlstrand, Professor of World Christianity and Interreligious Studies, Faculty of Theology, Uppsala University. Prof. Kajsa Ahlstrand is specialized on Theology of Religion and Interreligious Dialogue. In her research, she has focused on the relation between Tradition and Modernity in the religions, and religion within a postmodern society.]

[Dr. Rijk van Dijk, main researcher at the African Studies Centre in Leiden. His research focuses on the rise of Pentecostalism in Africa, in relation to globalization and transnational connections. His current research includes the relationship between Pentecostalism and sexuality. He is editor-in-chief of *African Diaspora*.]

[Dr. Peter Stromberg, is Professor of Anthropology at the University of Tulsa. Dr. Stromberg received his Ph.D. in Cultural Anthropology from Stanford in 1981. He published a study of “commitment system” in a Swedish free church in *Symbols of Community*, 1986 and a study of the Evangelical Christian conversion story in *Language and Self-Transformation*, 1992. His most recent book is *Caught in Play*, 2009.]
